



NEW! Prehospital Opioid/Opiate Overdose Reporting Tool Instructions for Law Enforcement and Non-AZ-PIERS EMS Agencies



If you know the type of destination to which the patient was transported, your selected answer will cause an additional box to appear that had been hidden before.

If you select a Hospital or Emergency Department, you will get a new box with a picklist of Hospitals to pick from.

If you select any other type of destination, you will get a text box into which you can enter the name of the particular facility or clinic, etc. to which the patient was transported.

When you have finished answering the questions, click the green "Save" button in the upper left of the screen, then click "Close".

Troubleshooting tips:

- If you see the below message, asking you to allow azdhs.gov to use additional storage on your computer, click "Yes"



- Rarely, browsers will not allow a user to log into the website and the user will get an error message.
 - o You may just need to close the browser (all tabs) and re-open.
 - o The system should work with Chrome, Safari, Foxfire, and Internet Explorer 11 (or higher). If you have more than one browser available to you, try the other if one does not appear to be functioning correctly.
 - o This may mean your browser cache is full. As you visit web pages, more information is stored in your browser cache. Clearing your browser cache can help prevent "caching" issues and prevent your device from running out of space to cache data.
 - o If the system is being updated for routine maintenance, it can be out of service for a few minutes. Waiting a few minutes and trying again should work if this is the case.



- When filling out the report, you will see a 'Validation' in red and a 'Status' of In Progress at the bottom of your screen. Please ignore these if you are only reporting suspected Opioid overdoses & deaths as these are product features which only apply to EMS agencies reporting full patient care records.
